

Winter Welcome- Queen Size

In order to complete this quilt, you will need to purchase the original pattern. The following are additional instructions to make the original wallhanging/lap quilt into a queen size bed quilt.

Sixth Border

1. After instructions for "Outer Border" for main quilt, continue with these instructions.
2. From Gold Dot fabric, cut 3 – 2 ½" x WOF strips. Join all three strips together and cut two pieces measuring 2 ½" x 50 ½". Attach these pieces to top and bottom of quilt.
3. From Gold Dot fabric, cut 3 – 3 ½" x WOF strips. Join all three strips together and cut two pieces measuring 3 ½" x 58 ½". Attach these pieces to the sides of the quilt. Quilt top now measures 56 ½" x 58 ½".

Seventh Border

The pieced blocks in this border are the same as the pieced blocks in the first pieced border except that they measure 9 ½" square instead of 6 ½" square. Follow the instructions below to piece the blocks and cut measurements 1 – 9 out of the Holly on Red fabric. Join the units together as set out in the diagram below making the top and bottom borders first. Then attach the side borders. When complete, this section of the quilt should measure 74 ½" x 76 ½" .

A= Beige Snow and Black Dot Nine Patch (3 total)

B= Gold Dot and Green Mitt Friendship Star (3 total)

C= Gold Dot and Blue Snow Friendship Star (4 total)

D= Black Dot, Red Holly and Holly on Gold Rail Fence (4 total)

Rail Fence Blocks



1. There are four rail fence blocks in this border. From each of your extra cuts of red holly, holly on gold and black dot, cut 1 - 3 ½" strips.
2. Join the black strip lengthwise with the red strip and then add the gold strip to the red

strip, pressing your seams all in the same direction. Using your square ruler, sub cut the rail fence units into 4 - 9 ½" squares.

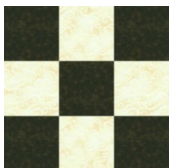
Friendship Stars



There are 7 friendship stars in this border. They all feature the gold dot as the star with two different background fabrics. There are three friendship star blocks with the green mitts on beige fabric and four with the blue snow fabric as the background.

1. From your extra cut of gold dot fabric, cut 2 - 3 7/8" strips and 1 - 3 ½" strip. Set the 3 7/8" strips aside. From the 3 ½" strip, sub cut 7 - 3 ½" squares. This is enough for the centres of all your stars.
2. From your green mitts on beige fat quarter, cut 1 - 3 7/8" strip and 1 - 3 ½" strip. Press the 3 7/8" strip with right sides together with one of the gold dot 3 7/8" strips. Sub cut the pressed strips into 6 - 3 7/8" squares. On one of the wrong sides of these pressed units, draw a diagonal line from the top left corner to the bottom right corner. Using this as a guide, sew a ¼" seam on either side of the line. Repeat for all 6 pressed squares. Cut down the diagonal line and press the squares open. Squares should measure 3 ½". Trim off overlapping triangles.
3. From the green mitts on beige 3 ½" strip, sub cut 12 - 3 ½" squares.
4. Using the pictured friendship star block as a guide, join the squares together to form the three friendship star blocks using the green mitts on beige background.
5. Repeat instructions with the blue snow fabric as the background. Cut 1 - 3 7/8" strip and 2 - 3 ½" strips from the blue snow fabric. Because you will be making 4 friendship stars with blue snow background, you need to cut 8 - 3 7/8" squares from the pressed strips and 16 - 3 ½" squares from the blue snow fabric.

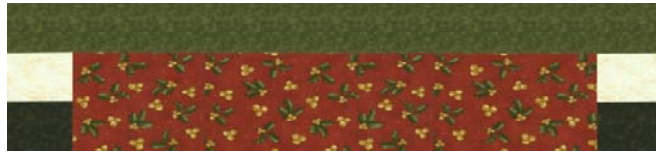
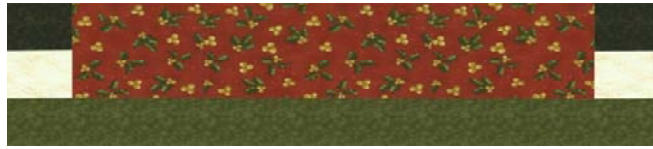
Nine Patch Blocks



1. There are three of these blocks in this border. There are also four partial nine patch blocks in the final border. Cut 3 - 3 ½" strips from your extra black dot fabric and 3 - 3 ½" strips from your beige snow fabric. This will be enough strips for this and the final border.
2. To form the outer sides of the nine patch blocks, join a black strip to a beige strip and then to another black strip. Press seams toward the black fabric. This unit will measure 9 ½" x approximately 44". Sub cut from this unit, 10 - 9 ½" x 3 ½" strips.
3. To form the centre of the nine patch blocks, join a beige strip to a black strip and then to another beige strip. Press seams toward the black fabric. This unit will measure 9 ½" x approximately 44". Sub cut from this unit, 7 - 9 ½" x 3 ½" strips.
4. Join an outer side strip to either side of the 3 centre strips to form 3 nine patch units. The remaining units will be used in the final border.
5. Piece the seventh border together as set out above.

Bottom Final Border

1. From your extra holly on red fabric, cut 4 – 6 ½” strips. Join together and sub cut two lengths measuring 6 ½” x 68 ½”. From leftover strip sets from the nine patch units (do not use not any of your pre-cut strips), cut four 3 ½” strips from either strip set. Using your seam ripper to remove the appropriate square so that you have 4 units with one black square and one beige square attached to form a 6 ½” x 3 ½” rectangle. Attach the rectangle units to either end of the holly on red length as shown above.
2. From your extra green dot fabric, cut 4 – 3 ½” strips. Join together and sub cut two lengths measuring 3 ½” x 74 ½”. Attach to holly on red units as shown in picture to form either the top or bottom final borders. Attach these borders to the quilt top.

Left Side Border

3. From your extra holly on red fabric, cut 4 – 3 ½” strips. Join together and sub cut two lengths measuring 3 ½” x 76 ½”.

4. From your extra green dot fabric, cut 4 – 3 ½” strips. Join together and sub cut two lengths measuring 3 ½” x 76 ½”.

5. Join your holly on red and green dot lengths together as shown on the left and right of this paragraph.

6. Using the precut strips from the nine patch blocks, join the appropriate strips together in to form the top and bottom units of the side borders and attach to side borders as shown in the pictures. Attach side borders to quilt top.

Binding

Follow instructions for binding from original pattern except cut and join 10 - 2 ½ x WOF strips.
